You and your pet are in Germany. Now what?

Register your pet at the Wiesbaden VTF. Registration is required within 14 days of arrival to Germany or receiving a new pet. If you do not register, you could be subject to German Pet Taxes.

The VTF is located at BLDG 1038 across from the library. The clinic hours are Monday 0800-1130 and 1300-1600 Tuesday-Thursday 0800-1200 and 1300-1600 and Friday 0800-1200. The VTF is also closed on all Training Holidays and Federal Holidays. You do not need an appointment to register your pet. * PLEASE NOTE THAT THURSDAYS WILL BE OPEN STARTING IN FEBRUARY*

In order to register your pet, you <u>MUST</u> bring vaccine and health records. Registration documents without these forms will not be accepted.

if your pet has ONLY received care from a military clinic, records are NOT required

- Update your pet's microchip number in the TASSO system. This is a Germany wide microchip database that can reunite your pet with you if they get lost.
- The VTF is not an emergency clinic. The VTF provides services such as basic checkups, vaccines, health certificates and non-emergency sick calls on a space A basis. There are many emergency and urgent care clinics located off base. You will receive a brochure upon registering with the VTF.
- The VTF is not a walk-in clinic. Most appointments are 3-4 weeks out when scheduled, so finding your pet an off-base vet is beneficial. Space is limited, which is why it's important to establish care with an off-base vet as well.
- Medications: If your pet is currently on a medication, you will need to schedule an
 appointment with the VTF to get refilled. Some medications are special ordered and may take 23 weeks to get to our clinic.
- <u>Prescription Foods:</u> You do not need a prescription for most foods in Germany. Any local pet store should have what you need, or there are online stores to buy from.
- Pet Passports: A pet passport must be issued by a German Vet, and they must receive a
 Rabies vaccination for it to be a legal document. A pet passport is used to enter EU countries. An
 additional health certificate is required to enter the United States.
- Spay/Neuter/Dental Procedures: Our clinic does provide these services; however, we
 have a wait list. Depending on operation tempo, the wait time can vary. For immediate
 procedures, there are off post vets who can provide services as well.
