

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Please keep in mind that your method of travel may have separate and additional requirements. Check with your airline or ship to determine what requirements they may have, if any.

These travel requirements apply to all pets <u>including</u> Service Animals and Emotional Support Animals.



As soon as you know your travel details, contact your local veterinarian to assist with the pet travel process, as each destination might have specific animal health requirements.

Other factors to consider:

Breed & age restrictions, appropriate kennel size, airline requirements, on-base housing pet requirements/restrictions, etc.

Are you taking your pet back to the States?



For PCS or leisure travel, here is your guide for flying your pets back home.



Your Pet's Checklist for Traveling to the U.S.:

- ⇒ Proof of an up-to-date Rabies
 Vaccination (administered 28 days or more prior to arrival)
- ⇒ ISO Microchip (administered before current Rabies vaccination)
- ⇒ Health Certificate
- ⇒ Acclimation Letter
- Dogs only: must be at least 6 months old at time of entry to the U.S.
- ⇒ <u>Dogs only</u>: CDC Dog Import Form

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- It is the pet owner's responsibility to make sure their pet has met U.S. entry requirements. Failure to meet these import requirements will result in problems upon arrival in the U.S.
- Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has certain requirements that must be met before a pet can be admitted into the United States.

- Proof of current rabies vaccination is required. (i.e. Rabies Certificate issued by a military VTF or an official EU Pet Passport issued by a licensed off-base vet)
- Pets must be at least 12 weeks old to receive the rabies vaccine.

If your pet's rabies coverage has lapsed or if this is their first vaccination, your pet must wait 28 days prior to travel to allow the vaccine to take effect.

- Health Certificates are required for all pets entering the United States and are only valid for 10 days after being issued.
- Appointments must be made with your vet well in advance to ensure your pet can be seen at the appropriate time.
